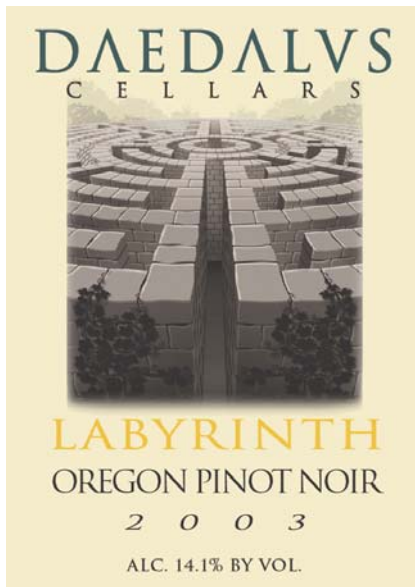

Daedalus (DAY-duh-lus) Cellars is a small, family-owned winery in Oregon's Willamette Valley. We source from some of the best vineyards in the state and handle the fruit minimally and carefully to create balanced wines with complex fruit and elegant structure. Their refinement makes them natural partners for a wide range of foods and ensures their graceful maturation.

Composed mostly of old-vine Pommard from Seven Springs and Maresh vineyards, with a dash each of Dijon 777 from Momtazi and Wädensvil from Hawks View Vineyards, this Labyrinth, as always strives for texture and movement. It smells and tastes of minerals, lavender, roses and violets. As usual, spontaneous fermentation and extremely careful handling preserve a lush mouthfeel and a rich mid-palate.

We recommend that you decant this wine.

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
